

# Liberty Tree Hanging Lantern

This style of lantern, with three tiers of decorated punchwork, has long been associated with the demonstrations against the Stamp Act of May 21, 1766, when it allegedly hung from the northwest bough of the Liberty Tree in Boston.

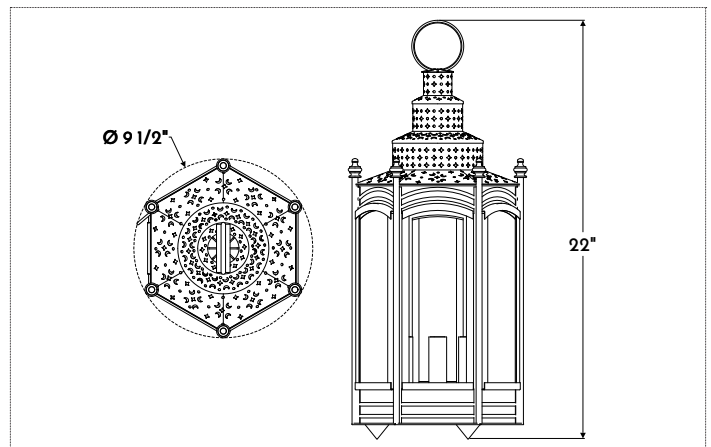
